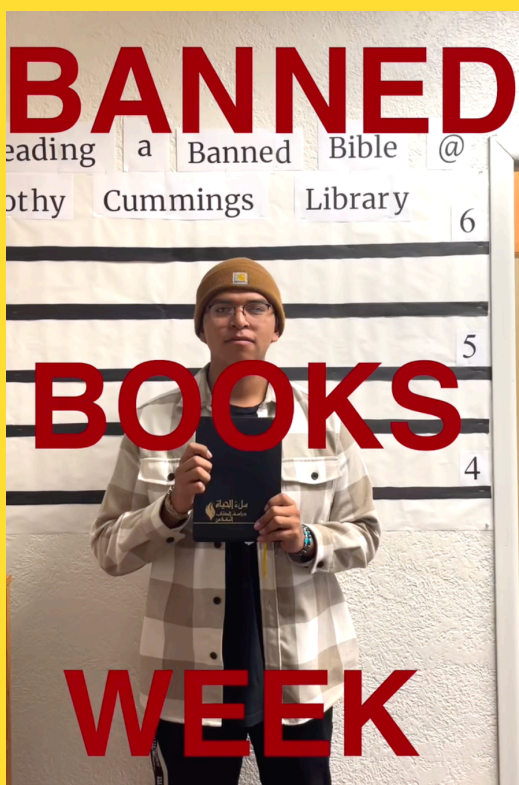


# A SPIRITUAL APPROACH TO BANNED BOOKS WEEK

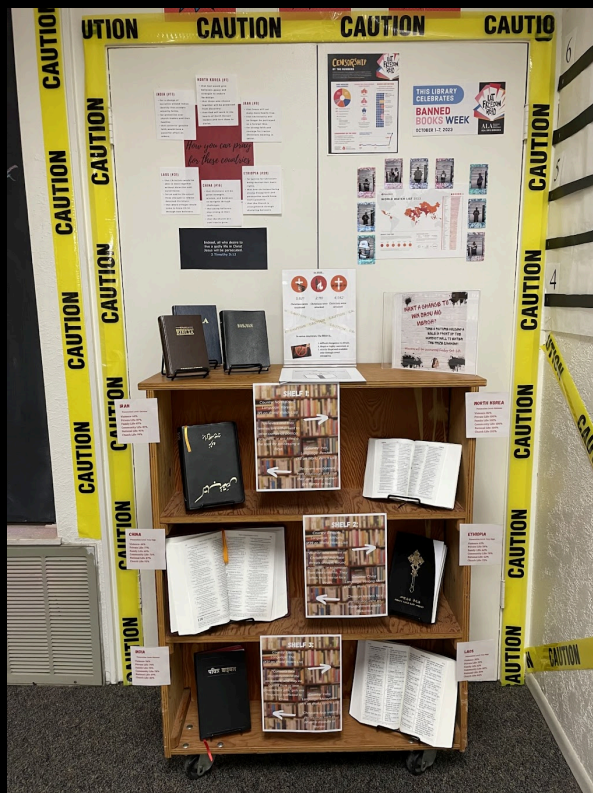


## A Spiritual Purpose

- Give patrons a global perspective on Christian discrimination and persecution.
- Encourage patrons to read their Bibles and pray for those who can't.
- Promote biblical values rather than the world's values.

## A Compelling Display

- Bibles of any language
- Books on Christian persecution (e.g. *Foxe's Book of Martyrs*, *Tortured for Christ*, *The Voice of the Martyrs*)
- Facts, statistics, and maps about Christian persecution and biblical censorship
- Relevant scriptures
- Mugshot wall
- Caution tape



## Meaningful Programming

- Take a mugshot with a banned Bible.
- Post trivia questions on social media accounts using the facts on display.
- Create Bible or prayer-related crafts.
- Spotlight the prayer country of the day during a corporate prayer time.
- Bring in a missionary to speak on issues affecting Christians around the world.
